

Wedding Day Checklist for Brides

Make sure you have the following items with you now that your wedding day has finally arrived.

- Wedding Day Attire
- Shoes, Undergarments
- Garter (*optional*)
- Something Old, New, Borrowed, and Blue
- Jewelry
- Handkerchief
- Perfume
- A copy of the Wedding Day Timeline
- A copy of the Wedding Program
- A copy of the Vows or Readings to be Recited at the Ceremony
- The gift for your bride/groom
- Eye Drops
- Aspirin or some other Pain Medication
- Your cell phone with your vendors' mobile numbers pre-programmed in it.
- Cell phone charger
- Nail Polish, Polish Remover and Manicure Kit
- Sewing Kit
- Hair products and hair necessities
- Cash (tips, emergencies, etc.)
- Spare car keys (and if local, Spare house keys)
- Toothbrush, toothpaste, breath mints, deodorant, lotion, perfume
- Make-Up



Special Moment Notes –

- Kiss your bride/groom as often as you can.
- If possible, ask your mother or grandmother to help you put on your jewelry. This mother/daughter moment will bring a tear to her eye. (***And, don't forget to ask the photographer to capture this moment.***)
- Breathe slowly and deeply, take one last look in the mirror. Then, get ready for that moment of a lifetime!

Wedding Day Checklist for Grooms

Essentials needed for your wedding day success!

- Tuxedo or Formal Suit
- Shoes, socks, underwear, cuff links and a spare tie
- Jewelry, watch
- Spare formal shirt, just in case.
- Cologne
- Large umbrella (just in case)
- A copy of the Wedding Day Timeline
- A copy of the Wedding Program
- Marriage License and the Officiant's Fee
- Gratuities
- Wedding Ring(s)
- A copy of the Vows or Readings to be Recited at the Ceremony
- A copy of the Written Toasts
- The gift for your bride/groom
- Your airline tickets and passports
- Airline and Hotel Reservations
- Arrangements for tux return
- Eye Drops
- Aspirin or some other Pain Medication
- Cell Phone with Your vendors' numbers pre-programmed in it.
- Cell phone charger
- Hair products
- Cash (tips, emergencies, etc.)
- Spare car keys (and if local, Spare house keys)
- Toothbrush, toothpaste, breath mints, deodorant, lotion, cologne



Don't Forget!

It's very easy to leave something that's special to you behind! So, here is a list of "easy to forget" items you should remember at the end of the evening.

- ❑ **Your wedding mementos.** Ask someone to pack your wedding mementos -
 - Family Heirlooms, Family Photos
 - Your Personal Flowers, Toasting Flutes, Cake Knife and Server,
 - The Garment Bags for the Clothes You are Wearing at the end of the night and Your Ring Boxes
 - Leftover Stationery from Your Wedding Day, Extra favors

- ❑ **A meal.** Ask a friend to pack a meal (*and some wedding cake*) for the two of you from your reception. You will be hungry later that evening.

- ❑ **Your marriage license.** Ask your officiant to mail the necessary paperwork before the deadline.

- ❑ **Your wedding gifts.** Ask a friend to pack up your gifts and deliver them to you when you return.

- ❑ **Your wedding cards.** Place them in a safe place until you return from your honeymoon.

- ❑ **Items in your "getting ready" room.** At the end of the night, ask a member of your wedding party to carefully check the room where you got ready room for items you may have left behind.

- ❑ **Your wedding attire.** Ask a friend or a member of your wedding party to take your gown or suit or tuxedo to a reputable drycleaner for cleaning/preservation. If you wore a rented tuxedo, ask a groomsman or family member to return your tuxedo.
